- ▶ Your account is synced to all the World Book resources that require a password. Create a project title and save items you find on World Book: Student with the timeline you created using World Book: Timeline and the primary documents you found on World Book: Reference Center.

World's Highest Bridge

Motorists in southwestern **China** can get around a little quicker this week, if they are willing to brave stupefying heights to do so. In late December 2016, the Beipanjiang Bridge opened to traffic after three years of construction. If you are afraid of heights, don't look down! China's newest **bridge** is the highest in the world.

As you probably know, a bridge is a structure used by people and vehicles to cross areas that are obstacles to travel. **Engineers** build bridges over lakes, rivers, canyons, and busy highways and railroads. China's Beipanjiang Bridge is a *cable-stayed bridge*. Cable-stayed bridges are similar to better-known *suspension bridges*. Both types of
